ORDINANCE ENACTED BY THE 15TH SANGGUNIANG PANLALAWIGAN OF AGUSAN DEL NORTE, IN ITS 127TH REGULAR SESSION HELD AT THE SP SESSION HALL, PROVINCIAL CAPITOL COMPOUND, BUTUAN CITY ON APRIL 10, 2013.

PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 320-2013

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A TRUST FUND FOR THE USE OF THE PROVINCIAL HEALTH OFFICE ANIMAL BITE TREATMENT CENTER AND PROVIDING A POLICY GUIDELINES FOR ITS EFFECTIVE IMPLEMENTATION

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, in sessio Eduly assembled that;

CHAPTER 1

GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. TITLE- This ordinance shall be known as "An Ordinance Establishing a Trust Fund for the Use of the Provincial Health Office Animal Bite Treatment Center and Providing Guidelines for its Effective Implementation."

SECTION 2. OBJECTIVE- This ordinance aims to establish a policy guideline for the utilization of the Philhealth Animal Bite Outpatient Benefit Package Reimbursement and to create a Trust Fund to ensure that funds from the Philhealth Animal Bite Benefit Package Reimbursement be utilized solely by the Agusan del Norte Provincial Health Office Animal Bite Treatment Center.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS- The following words or terms used in the ordinance shall have the meaning given in this Section, as follows;

1. Post exposure Prophylaxis (PEP)

-anti-rables treatment administered after an exposure (such as bite, scratch, lick, etc.) to potential rabid animal

2. Animal Bite Treatment Centers (ABTC)

-refer to government facilities certified by the Department of Health (DOH) as capable of managing victims of animal

Completed treatment- refers to a case of animal bite that has received Day 0,
Day 3, and Day 7 of the anti-rabies treatment
course.

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SECTION 4. COVERAGE OF THE PHILHEALTH ANIMAL BITE OUTPATIENT BENEFIT PACKAGE- The package shall cover the following:

- a. The cost of providing Post-Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP) service. The following are identified as reimbursable PEP service items.
 - i. Rabbies vaccine
 - Purified Vero Cell Rabies Vaccine (PVRV) or
 - Purified Chick Embryo Vaccine (PCECV)
 - ii. Rabies Immune Globulin (RIG)
 - Human Rabies Immune Globulin (HRIG) or
 - Purified Equine Rabies Globulin (PERIG)
 - iii. Local wound care
 - iv. Tetanus toxoid and anti-tetanus serum (ATS)
 - v. Anti-biotics
 - vi. Supplies such as, but not limited to syringes, cotton, alcohol and other antiseptics
- b. Dog bites primarily. However, persons bitten by other domestic animals (e.g. cats) and livestock (e.g. cows, pigs, horses, goats) as well as wild animals (bats, monkeys) may be covered
- c. Category III Rabies Exposure
 - i. Transdermal bite (puncture wounds, lacerations, avulsions) or scratches/abrasions with spontaneous bleeding.)
 - ii. Exposure to a rabies patient through bites, contamination of mucous membranes (eyes, oral/nasal mucosa, genital/anal mucous membrane or open skin lesions with body fluids through splattering and mouth-to mouth resuscitation.
 - iii. Handling of infected carcass or ingestion of raw infected meat.
- d. Category II rabies exposure involving the head neck.

CHAPTER II

IMPLEMENTING OFFICE & GUIDELINES

SECTION 5. IMPLEMENTING OFFICE- The Provincial Health Office is responsible for the implementation and monitoring the effective execution of the ordinance.

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SECTION 6. COST OF THE PACKAGE- There shall be collected the amount of Three Thousand Pesos (P3,000.00) for every Philhealth member who shall avail of the benefit package which shall be collected by the Provincial Health Office Animal Bite Treatment Center. The Benefit Package fixed by this ordinance shall include the following:

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SECTION 7. USAGE OF THE FUND - No other operational expenses shall be charged to the Trust Fund Account of the Philhealth Animal Bite Outpatient Benefit Package Reimbursement except for the use of the Animal Bite Treatment Center.

SECTION 8. REPEALING CLAUSE- All provincial ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby deemed repealed, superseded, amended or modified accordingly.

SECTION 9. EFFECTIVITY- This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval.
